



**6.2 Review/Take Action in Setting Pre-K Daily Tuition Rate as per Policy IDA Pre-Kindergarten Program –**  
There was significant discussion regarding what the tuition rate would be for non-resident Pre-K students. Supt. Mattos stated that Pre-K attends school 58% of the school year (101 of 175 days). Based on 58%, the maximum tuition rate for the year would be \$6,909. (58% of full year tuition of \$10,515.49). D. Polky asked about fairness to some students not currently paying, and now they will have to start paying. Discussion also included concern about FCS being inconsistent in assigning tuition rates in the past several years (\$5/day, no tuition rate), and fairness (to parents and taxpayers) in considering current private child care costs, etc. It was agreed that a fair rate needs to be established that is fair to all stakeholder groups.

Motion: To set the rate of \$25.00 per day as the tuition rate for the Pre-K Program.

**6.3 Review Status of FCS Roofing and Ventilation Project –** Supt. Mattos suggested that the Sch. Comm. would try to cover the overage of \$11,000.00 in the current school budget. R. Holland noted a concern that if we wait to ask the Town for help with this when it is discovered, that the Town Budget Comm. may have the impression that we have created extra money in this budget. Supt. Mattos offered that we have time to wait to see what comes up in the future to see if we have a way to cover the overage with the school budget. He reported that we did receive the full \$64,000 from the insurance claim from the roofing supply company. There was conversation about the potential for continued problems with the roof over the kitchen. D. Polky noted that roof raking might be of help for that potential problem.

## 7. **New Business**

**7.1 Update on FSC Technology Integration Partnership with RSU 38 –** Supt. Mattos noted that we are in a partnership with RSU 38 for Technology services. He also noted that we are also continuing to receive time with D. Picard, providing additional instruction. We will evaluate along the way and continue to listen to feedback.

**7.2 Review Policy JFB – School Choice/Open Enrollment –** It has been noted that the Insured Value Factor of \$680.00 per student makes Kents Hill School more expensive as a school of choice for our tuition students. Supt. Mattos noted that it is possible that it could be negotiated for a lower rate. It was reiterated that school choice is important to our students. Supt. Mattos suggested that the Sch. Comm. have a discussion about this policy at some point to decide whether they want to maintain or make changes.

**7.3 Discussion – 45<sup>th</sup> Annual MSMA Fall Conference –** Supt. Mattos reintroduced the information for the upcoming MSMA Fall conference, taking place October 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>.
