**MHT 140, Community Mental Health

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is designed to focus on the history and systems specific to our current mental health system and the potential plan for our future delivery systems. The community's role in impacting the mental health system will be examined.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Upon successful completion of this course, the student should be able to:

1. Describe the theory and historical foundations of the community mental health system.
2. Describe the potential relevance of the community as a process and/or method for addressing major mental health social problems.
3. Apply the existing empirical knowledge base, including effective modes of community based intervention, to impact change in his or her community based mental health delivery system.
4. Relate practical field experience to community mental health systems.
5. Apply critical thinking skills to the issues of community mental health.
6. Demonstrate proficiency in civic engagement.
