Due to increased costs and decreased subsidy in our food service program, I am recommending the meal pricing for Maranacook Schools students' increase by .25. This will place the full cost lunch for students as follows:

Elementary and Middle Schools	from \$2.75 to \$3.00
High School	from \$3.00 to \$3.25

Breakfast will remain the same at \$1.00 for the elementary and middle school students, and \$1.25 for high school students.

Re: Transfers Between Warrant Article Cost Centers

Statute allows for 5% of a warrant article to be transferred to another warrant article. This statute also requires the school board to approve this transfer. Exact language is below:

“Transfer between budget cost center lines. During the year for which the budget is approved using the cost center summary budget format, the regional school unit board may transfer an amount not exceeding 5% of the total appropriation for any cost center to another cost center or among other cost centers without voter approval.”

Two warrant articles are anticipated to be over expended at the end of this school year. The transfers below are higher than the anticipated overages because there is still additional time before the end of the fiscal year and I wanted to make sure there was some cushion for unexpected expenses.

Below is an explanation of the articles that will be over expended:

System Administration will be over expended due to mediation and fact finding costs for negotiations, Futures Search expenses, superintendent search expenses, and legal fees.

All Other Expenses will be over expended due to additional funds needed to be transferred into Food Service due to food services personnel expenses being greater than anticipated, food service revenue being less than anticipated, and no longer having a beginning balance to help offset expenses.

Now, therefore, agreeable to the provisions of M.R.S.A. 20-A, §1489, you are hereby required, in the name of the State of Maine and Maine Regional School Unit Number 38 to assess the sum of Two million two hundred eighteen thousand nine hundred ninety-seven dollars and no cents, (\$2,218,997.00), upon the taxable estates within the Town of Wayne according to the provisions of law for the assessment of taxes; and in making said assessment, you are required to add the sum aforesaid to the amount of state, county and town taxes to be by you assessed.

And you are alike required to pay or issue your warrants to the several constables or collectors of said town requiring them respectively to levy and collect the sum of Two million two hundred eighteen thousand nine hundred ninety-seven dollars and no cents, (\$2,218,997.00), and to pay to the town treasurer the aforesaid sum set against said town, to be paid by said town treasurer to the treasurer of Maine Regional School Unit Number 38 in twelve equal monthly installments on or before the 20th of each of the months, July 2018 to June 2019.
